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Preface

Creation of catalogue

The descriptions of most of the Islamic, Arabic, Persian, and Turkish manuscripts are taken from the catalogue by E. Birnbaum (1960). The remaining Oriental Library MSS have yet to be properly described, and the details given in this handlist are merely a transcript of such information as is recorded in the Inventory of Oriental Manuscripts, the basic accessions record.

Contents

A miscellaneous group of documents originally collected by Durham University Oriental Library. After the merging of the various University libraries, this material was transferred to the care of Archives and Special Collections, where it formed this separate sequence. Some items have been re-located into more appropriate collections, and some material has been added since the mergers. Some items share a common provenance with material now in Durham University Oriental Museum or amongst the printed books in the Oriental sequences of Durham University Library.

The provenance of some items is not recorded. Most of the material was accessioned by the Oriental Library.

Press cutting pasted to the inside back cover - letter to *The Times* (11 July 1942) from H.H. Dale, chairman of the Wellcome Trustees, concerning the restoration of "King Theodore's Bible" to H.I.M. Hailie Selassie.

Provenance: Typescript note (c. 1930-1933) attached to inside cover reads: "Lent by Rev. Canon De Boinville, MA, RD, The Rectory, Oxswich, Glam." A loose note (c. 1889) in the hand of Rev. Basil Chastel de Boinville, identifies the ms. as an "Ethiopic Psalter", and records it to have been "taken by a British soldier at the Sacking of Magdala during the Abyssinian War. Found on the body of a priest, who lost his life in an attempt to rescue it from a heathen temple".

Ownership history: Small circular label inside back cover Church Congress exhibition No. 355.

Formerly miscatalogued as Amharic, and as such was assigned its current shelfmark.

Occasional mistakes corrected in a rough hand in the margin. Several scraps of paper containing extracts of the Qur'an, prayers, etc. are loose inside the book, and also one containing a piece in Urdu.

Full page illuminated `*unwans* at first opening. some headings in white ink on gold ground. "Parts" marked in ornamental frames in the margins.

ORI/Arab.3 [1730s ?]

Kitab Shawahid al-Qat Anonymous grammatical commentary (parsing) on the verses cited in the grammatical work *Qatr al-nadá wa-ball al-ṣadá* of `Abd Allah Ibn Hisham. There is no*dibaja*.

The margins of the manuscript are decorated with crude drawings in red, yellow and black ink, often of subjects mentioned in the text: human beings, including a priest, animals (including birds, a gazelle, camel, snake, mouse, ostrich), weapons,the sun, and the devil (on the penultimate leaf) labelled *Shaitan*. At the end of the text is a magic circle with 4 names of God in the outer ring. At the bottom of the page is a note in yellow ink "The number of pictures in this book is forty". That the pictures were drawn after the book was copied is evident from the fact that the supply leaves too are illustrated. Also the drawing of "a man of quality (*shakhs karim*) on f.17a issuperimposed on a marginal note in the same hand as the text. The manuscript is not dated by either main scribe, but on the last leaf the date (910 A.H./1514) has been added. It is not certain that this date is genuine. Below, in another hand, thedates 1150 A.H./1737 and Jamada 1151/1738 appear.

f.1-10 are supply leaves, considerably later and more untidy than f.11 onwards. The paper of f.1-10 is European (probably Venetian) and bears the watermarks P B and the three crescents (trilune). f.11 onwards isalso European, having the trilune watermark. 41 f.

ORI/Arab.4 1224 A.H [1809]

'Amilī, Bahā' al-Dīn Muḥammad ibn Ḥusayn, *Khulāṣat al-ḥisāb*, a mathematical work. It is divided into a *mukaddima* and 10 *babs*. there are many tables in the text. The manuscript is dated *Sha`ban* 1224 A.H (1809). Preceeding the text (f.2) and on the whole of f.8 there are mathematical notes in small *ta`lik*. There are also frequent marginal notes in *ta`lik* in the margins of the manuscript. An owners seal appears on f.27b. f.33b-34a blank.

f.34b-39b. A short grammatical work; no author mentioned. f.34b, line 4, reads: "Treatise containing the solution of certain difficult forms ...". Divided into two *fasls* as indicated by numbers in square brackets. The last few pages of the text, comprising most of *fasl* 2 are lost. Themanuscript contains a Persian stamp of inspection (f.3a and 39b) dated 1311/1893-4.

Ownership history: A note on the flyleaf bears the title of the work as it appears in Lee's *Oriental manuscripts purchased in Turkey*(1840), signed G.C.R. Inside the cover there is also the later armorial bookplate of John Lee of Hartwell (motto Verum atque Decens, engraved by Mutlow, York St). Beneath thetitle on f.1 there is a note in an earlier hand "L'art de Connoitre les diverses qualités des chevaux ...".

ORI/Arab.7 20th Sha`ban 1245 A. H. (February 1830)

A compilation of mixed character, largely on the esoteric value of letters and particular portions of the *Qur'an*, and their use as charms and in prayers. Occasional headings *fasl*, more frequently *fa'ida*. Includes charms and spells.

f.2a. Begins with astatement from a work entitled *Kabs al-iktida* by Ahmad al-Buni (d.622/1225), a well known writer on the esoteric value of letters.

f.9a: *Fa'ida li tahyij al-bah* an aphrodisiac remedy (by charm).

f.11a: A remedy against impotence.

f.12a: A charm for the destruction of enemies.

f.13a: A charm to be used when entering the presence of tyrannical rulers, quoted in the name of Muhammad al-Barisi al-Maghribi.

f.14b: To cast a spell on tyrants.

f.19b: That the name of Muhammad corresponds with the names of God.

f.24b: Quotes al-Buni's works *al-Lum`a al-nuraniya* and *Shams al-ma`arif* on the names of God.

f.42b: Citation of a *fa'ida* of Shihab al-Din Ahmad b. Musa al-`Ujail (d. 690/1291). f.44b: Recipe for a *ma`jun*

f.45 onwards: Spells, charms, prayers and scribbles in a variety of hands.

ORI/Arab.8 [18th century?]

A *majmun `na* consisting of a number of fragments in different hands and of differing ages, all bound together in considerable confusion. Many of them are magical and religious, giving the texts of various spells and prayers.

f.1-24. Fragment without title or author of a work on charms and magic, in a good *naskhi* hand, with headings in red. One of the texts is described thus "found in the handwriting of Shaikh Shamsal-Din al-Kadiri" (f.8a). Among the spells is one for "killing and destorying a person" (f.11b) and a number of love spells. There is also a description of the power of the "Blessed Seal ... which is the Greatest Name of God" (f.20ff)

f.25-50. A fragment of a magical-religious work, similar in character. No title or author: begins in the middle of a sentence. No headings. Contains the text of a number of prayers. f.29b: In a different hand at the bottom of the page is thedate A.H. 1050. f.30a: Fragment attributed to al-Ghazzali's work *Fi khwass al-fatiha*. f.51-55. Fragments of prayers in a different hand. Begins in mid-sentence; f.51b. Blank execept for a note in an illiterate hand at the top dated *Dhu al Ka`da* 1190 A.H. (November - December 1776).

f.56. Leaf recording a birth in *Shawwal* 1164 A.H. (August - September 1751). f.57-64. Fragment of prayers and incantations in another different hand, a crude *naskhi* with red headings. f.58b. 2 prayers attributed to al-Shafi`i f.62a. Prayer f.63b. Prayer attributed to `Ali b. AbiTalib

f.65. Further fragments of prayers in a much later hand, on similar paper.

f.66b. Embossed stamp.

A work on geomancy (*raml*), followed by charms, etc. The beginning of the manuscript is missing and the first page is in a bad state. The last pages are in a different and better hand. The work contains about 15 mainsections headed in red, each subdivided by headings in red. Authorities mentioned by the author include `Abu `Abd Allah al-al-Zanati and 'Shihab al-Din.

p.1-70. *Malhamat Daniyal `alaih al-salam `ala al-ashhur wa al-sinnin al-rumiya ...* attributed to 'Daniel'. A popular calendrical-astronomical work, giving the forecasts of events, according to the weekday on which the Syrian(*rumi*) months begin, eclipses, etc.

p.71-125, in the same hand. `Ali al-Hakimi al-Basir, *Kitab fi-ma yata `allak bi-tulu`al-Shi`ra al-yamaniya* A popular work of similar character to the preceding one, with particular reference to forecasting events according to the rise of Sirius; sayings of Hermes andPtolemy are quoted. There are comparative tables of the Coptic and Syrian (*rumi*) months on p.1 and the page preceeding it, and a note (with table) of the Coptic months at the bottom of p.125, and another in pencil onp.126.

p.127-130. *Fa'ida fi al-muhabba fi al-wfk al-murabba*` Anonymous work giving love charms.

Abu `Abd Allah Muhammad b. Yusuf al-Sanusi [vocalised Sunusi] al-Hasani (d.892/1486), *al-Mukaddima* (?) Earlier and later part vocalised, with interlinear and marginal notes in anAfrican language. Scribe: Abu Bakr ... (last leaf). Abu `Abd Allah Muhammad b. Yusuf al-Sanusi (d.892/1486), Possibly al-Sanusi's *Umm al-barahin* or his *al-`Akida al-Kubra* Fully vocalised, fair West African Maghribi, with interlinearand marginal notes in an African language. From f.17b to the end, the text is mostly in an African language, with occasional Arabic quotations. There appears to be a leaf or more missing between f.1 and f.2.

Muhammad b. `Umar b. Abi Muhli (f.1b), *Kitab Ibn `Umar Kubra* A work of `*aka'id* and *Maliki fikh*. Interlinear and marginal notes in Arabic and in anAfrican language; vocalised. Frequent reference is made to the work of al-Sanusi: presumably to `*Akidat ahl al-tauhid ...* commonly called *al-`Akida al-Kubra* by Muhammad b. Yusuf al-Sanusi(d. c.892/1486) and its commentary (*Sharh*) by the author himself, entitled `*Umdat ahl al-taufik wa 'l-ta`did*. There is frequent mention of Kahlil b. Ishak al-Jundi (d. 767/1365) author ofthe famous *Maliki* work of *fikh*, *al-Muhtasar*. Other writers mentioned include `Iyad al-Yahsubi (d.544/1149) and `Abd al-Wahhab al-Sha`rawi (d.973/1656), who wereboth *Malikites*.

ORI/Arab.13 [early 19th century]

The first portion of the grammatical work by Birgivi Mehmet, *Izḥār al-asrār*, corresponding to p.34-41 line 12 of the Izhar printed (p.34-64) with Ibn al-Hajib's *al-Kafiya*, Istanbul ed. of `Abd al-Rahim (1234 A. H.) The manuscript is in the neathand of Antoine Isaac, Baron Silvestre de Sacy, the 19th century French orientalist. It is unvocalised and only partly furnished with diacritical marks. In the margin are occasional numbers, presumably marking lines on the manuscript from which hecopied. The first is 10 (opposite de Sacy's second line), the last is 100 (opposite the 3rd line from the end). The writing stops in the middle of f.4a in the middle of a subject.

Provenance: Found in a copy of Zaynī'zādah's *Mu`rib al-izhar* (Üsküdar, 1218 A.H.) bought 1956 from Kegan Paul. This had come from the library assembled by Ferrao de Castelbranco, a Portugese nobleman who was a pupil of Silvestre de Sacy and had acquired it fromhis library.

ORI/Arab.14 [19th century]

A note book containing a varied assortment of notes on different topics. In *ruk* a hand. Formulae for making various substances. Preceded by a page on which is written a date (January 1822 o.s = 1821 n.s.) A formulafor manufacturing black ink is included and following it a formula for *sandarus-i Faranji* (European sandarac) in Italian (European hand).

(Starting the book from the other end). *Naskhi* hand. Mnemonics, verses and other devices to remember various things, including e.g. numerical values of letters, relative measures of length.

This copy was written in 1507/1508, by a calligrapher called Ali Bin Mirza Muhammad Bin Qurman (the name Mirza suggests thathe was probably Iranian). It also has the stamp and name of somebody who owned it later, probably in the 18/19th century. *Language:* Arabic

A note on the roller states that it would normally be mounted on a single roller but that two have been used to show how the double roller was used. With a letter from Temple Chevallier, Durham, 11 February 1853, noting that it was given by Charles Best Robinson and recording two minor textual variants (Robinson later changed his name to Norcliffe). *Language:* Hebrew

Gulistān or *Golestān*, meaning "Rose Garden", is a collection of moralistic and didactic verse and prose in eight chapters. This manuscript is in an excellent condition, written in gold, blue and red. Fine pair of full page 'unwans at first opening. Written in a fine nastalik script, 15 lines to the page, in double gold ruled frames, within blue frames. 9 full page and one half page miniatures, some are damaged, in some cases the faces are deliberately scratched out. A fine copy, owner's seal on the f.1a.

Ownership history: On the back fly leaf is the signature James H. Simpson. Liverpool, 19th century?

ORI/Pers. 2 between 886 and 889 AH / 1481-1484

Manuscript copy of Jāmī abd al-Rahmān (عبدالرحمان جامى) *Toḥfat al-aḥrār* ('Gift of the Free' - literature, poetry, moral themes and anecdote) and *Sobḥat al-abrār* ('Rosary of the Pious' about the principals of Sufism), the third and fourth of his series of seven masnavis *Haft Aurang*.

Colophon states that this was copied "in the course of the months of the year eight hundred and eighty and" (the scribe has forgotten to add the last digit of the year). Fair Nastalik script, titles in red and frames are in red, gold and blue.
